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Preface

IGNITEHer – Growing the Girls’ Game, Together

Girls belong in soccer—not just on the field, but at the heart of our soccer communities.

The **IGNITEHer Girls Program** was created in response to what we see, hear, and believe: that girls thrive when they are supported in environments that value belonging, development, leadership, and confidence. Across our communities, families have shared a desire for programs that do more than offer a place to play—programs that intentionally support girls as athletes and as people.

IGNITEHer is a commitment to creating meaningful, high-quality experiences for girls at every stage of their soccer journey. From their first touches on the ball to opportunities as players, coaches, referees, and leaders, this initiative is designed to ensure girls and women feel welcomed, challenged, supported, and inspired to stay in the game.

This document outlines the **pillars that guide the IGNITEHer program**. Each pillar represents a promise—one that shapes how we design programs, support volunteers, engage families, and build safe, positive environments. Together, these pillars provide a clear framework for consistent decision-making and long-term growth of the girls’ game across our district.

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BCSA Girls Program – Mission Statement

“Our mission is to ignite and grow the girls’ game by creating a soccer community where girls belong, lead, and stay. Through high-quality opportunities, inclusive environments, and leadership development, we transform passion for the game into lifelong confidence, resilience, and the skills needed to thrive on the pitch and in life.”



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Why This Program Exists

Girls enter soccer with excitement, curiosity, and confidence—but too many quietly drift away before they reach their full potential.

Across our rural communities, we see a consistent pattern: while many girls start playing sport at a young age, participation often declines as they grow older. This is rarely due to a lack of ability or interest. More often, girls step away because they no longer feel they belong, feel supported, or see a clear pathway forward that reflects who they are and who they can become.

The **IGNITEHer Girls Program** exists to intentionally address this reality.

Through parent feedback, volunteer conversations, and direct experience on and off the field, one message has been clear: girls benefit most from environments that are **welcoming, development-focused, safe, and empowering**. When programs are designed with these principles in mind, girls are more confident, more resilient, and far more likely to remain engaged in sport long-term.

For girls in rural and smaller communities, these challenges can be even more pronounced. Limited access to female role models, fewer program options, and logistical barriers can unintentionally reduce opportunities for girls to stay connected to the game. IGNITEHer was created to remove those barriers by being **intentional, visible, and community-driven**.

This program is not about separating girls from the game—it is about strengthening their place within it.

IGNITEHer focuses on:

- Creating spaces where girls **feel they belong**
- Supporting **age-appropriate development** at every stage
- Building **leadership pathways** for players, coaches, referees, and volunteers
- Inspiring confidence through **positive role models and experiences**
- Encouraging girls to **stay involved in soccer for life**

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At its core, IGNITEHer is a commitment—to girls, to families, and to our communities—that we will do more than simply offer programs. We will listen, adapt, and lead with purpose to ensure girls feel valued, supported, and excited to return each season.

Retention & Leadership Pathways (U16+)
